

ZONTA CLUB OF BENDIGO BREAST CUSHIONS:

In 2004 District 23 identified Breast Cushions as on-gong project for all clubs and in 2007 our Club began making and distributing cushions under the leadership of Sue Brown, Zonta Club of Bendigo Charter Member. This important project continues to this day.

Bendigo Members get together regularly to sew breast care cushions, which are distributed free to women in the region who have had surgery as part of breast cancer treatment. Once cut and sewn the cushions are placed in carry bag with a drawstring also made by ZCB members. For several years women at Tarrengower prison were also big contributors to the making and sewing of the cushions.

Sue Brown explained that the breast care nurse keeps in touch with her, and tells us when she needs more and then we arrange delivery and for more to be made.
